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## WILLIAM FLOYD HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT WINS SCHOLARSHIP TO STUDY CULINARY ARTS AT SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Ms. Glennerster's winning dish was composed of rosemary and thyme infused airline chicken breast with herb au jus, served with a potato and carrot risotto and sautéed green beans. This young chef aspires to continue her education after SCCC and one day own a restaurant or catering business in New Orleans, Louisiana, where she also hopes to teach culinary arts.

Jonathon Salgado of Valley Stream Central High School was awarded second place in the competition and Jessica Melendez of Sachem High School East finished in third place.
