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**HAMPTON BAYS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT WINS SCHOLARSHIP TO STUDY
CULINARY ARTS AT SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

Riverhead, NY – Luke Gustafson, of Hampton Bays High School, was the winner of a culinary competition for high school students held at Suffolk County Community College’s Culinary Arts and Hospitality Center in Riverhead. Each student participating in the competition utilized a modern culinary work station and was given one whole chicken, red potatoes and string beans. From these basic ingredients, they were instructed to create an imaginative meal ready to serve in one and a half hours. Students currently enrolled in the College’s culinary program assisted the contestants, providing spices and additional condiments as needed by the young chefs. The final meals were judged by five chef/instructors and were rated for taste, appearance, creativity, culinary technique, use of ingredients and cleanliness of work station, with points awarded in each category.

Mr. Gustafson’s winning dish was chicken with tomato and mushroom sauce, garlic mashed potatoes and seared string beans. Mr. Gustafson is currently employed as a line cook at Oakland’s in Hampton Bays.

Daniel Insoyna, a junior at Southold High School, came in second place; Ruben Bernacet, a senior at Bellport High School, came in third.

Richard Freilich, Director of Suffolk County Community College’s Culinary Arts Program, said the competition was created in 2008 to provide high school students with real-world experience. “This competition takes students a step closer to becoming professional chefs. It is a great opportunity to help them grow and to see if this is truly a career they want to pursue.”
