Brentwood, NY – Eugene Silberstein, Professor of Heating Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration (HVAC/R) on the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood, has recently had the title of Certified Master HVAC/R Educator (CMHE) conferred upon him by HVAC Excellence, the largest provider of certification in the HVACR industry.
