SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE ANNOUNCES RESULTS OF FIFTH ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL ART COMPETITION

Brentwood, NY – The Department of Arts and Humanities at the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood has announced the winners of the Fifth Annual High School Art Competition:

The College received 53 pieces of artwork from 44 student artists representing four area high schools - Brentwood High School, Commack High School, East Islip High School and West Babylon High School. Artwork was submitted in a wide variety of media, ranging from drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture and mixed media.

The competition was judged by members of the College's art faculty, including Curator and Professor Michaelann Tostanoski, Professor Celeste DeSario, Professor Jim DeSario, Professor Jeff Epstein, Professor Lucy Karwoski, Professor Allen Keener, Professor Kathryn Poletti, and Professor Elena Soterakis.
