Synopsis: This drama is one of the great history themed plays by William Shakespeare. Henry IV has died and his son--the young King Henry V--has just taken over the throne. Several bitter civil wars have left the people of England restless and dissatisfied. Furthermore, in order to gain the respect of the English people and the court, Henry must live down his wild adolescent past. King Henry rally's his forces with the patriotic speech "Once more unto the breach, dear friends, once more..."and England is united under his leadership. He then goes on to win the Battle of Agincourt and the French King surrenders. He offers Henry the hand of his daughter, Katherine of Valois, in marriage and unites England and France. After he marries Katherine, peace rules, and they have a son. However, after King Henry dies and his son becomes Henry VI, war once again looms.
