SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S ALBERTO CATANO WINS MEN'S 200 BACKSTROKE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Brentwood, NY – Suffolk County Community College first year student-athlete, Alberto Catano, of Ronkonkoma, recently represented the College at the NJCAA Men's Swimming and Diving National Championship at Indian River State College in Fort Pierce, Florida. With a first-place finish in the Men's 200 Backstroke, Mr. Catano was named national champion.

Dr. Shaun L. McKay, President of Suffolk County Community College said, "The mission of Suffolk County Community College is to promote intellectual discovery as well as physical development. Alberto Catano is successfully mastering both aspects of his life and should be commended for his outstanding performance and the ongoing dedication it takes to become a national champion."

Mr. Catano started swimming competitively at the age of 8. He attended Connetquot High School where he still holds six of the high school's current individual records, as well as two relay records. As a high school junior, Mr. Catano placed fourth in New York State in the 200 freestyle. He also made Junior Nationals in 2009.

Carlington Simms, Head Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Coach at Suffolk County Community College, stated, "We are so proud of Alberto. He is a tremendous athlete and a dedicated student. We know we will see more great achievements from him in the future."
