## SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRESENTS *IMAGES AND IMAGERY: EXPERIENCING CHINESE POETRY* ON OCTOBER 15, 2009 ON THE MICHAEL J. GRANT CAMPUS

Brentwood, NY – In celebration of Cultural Diversity Month, Suffolk County Community College will present, *Images and Imagery: Experiencing Chinese Poetry* on Thursday, October 15<sup>th</sup> from 2:00 – 3:15 p.m. in the mezzanine of the Van Nostrand Theatre on the Michael J. Grant Campus in Brentwood.

Professor Wenwei Du from Vassar College will give a lecture on Chinese culture as reflected through language and poetry. One aspect of Chinese poetry which has had significant influence on modern Western poets, is its use of concentrated images. This presentation will use Tang Dynasty poetry to illustrate the beauty and art of Chinese literature and linguistic culture.

The audience may be encouraged to produce their own English versions of the sample poem prior to hearing published translations. The audience's participation is a process of reproducing the poem's imagery and imagination in the mind. Thus, Chinese poetry is appreciated and understood not as an abstract concept but as a concrete image.

Dr. Wenwei Du teaches Chinese language and culture at Vassar College. He is currently serving as vice president of the Chinese Language Teachers Association of Greater New York (CLTA-GNY) and the president of the association of Chinese Oral and Performing Literatures (CHINOPERL). He has been a speaker in the Speakers in the Humanities Program sponsored by the New York Council for the Humanities.
