Selden, NY – Dr. Shaun L. McKay, President of Suffolk County Community College recently announced the following management appointments:

Nathaniel Pugh, Jr., Ph.D. has been appointed as Vice President for Planning and Institutional Effectiveness. In this role, Dr. Pugh will provide overall leadership for the College's strategic and institutional planning, as well as the assessment of College outcomes with regard to mission and goals, leadership and governance, student learning and institutional integrity. Dr. Pugh brings a broad range of higher education experience to this position, including 14 years of institutional planning, research and assessment at Clark Atlanta University, as well as teaching and administrative positions at the University of Georgia (Athens), Fort Valley State University (GA), Tennessee State University (Nashville), Georgia Southern College and the Georgia Institute of Technology. Most recently, he served as a senior consultant for the Atlanta Higher Education Group, providing reviews for standards established by regional accreditation agencies. Dr. Pugh earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from San Francisco State College and his Ph.D. from the University of California-Berkeley.

Mr. James D. Amoroso, CPA has been named Vice President for Business and Financial Affairs. In this position, Mr. Amoroso will serve as the College's chief financial officer. Mr. Amoroso earned an Associate's Degree in Accounting from Farmingdale State, a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting from Dowling College and a Master's Degree in Public Financial Management/Accounting from The American University in Washington, D.C. He is a member of the National Association of College and University Business Officers (NACUBO) and the Eastern Association of College and University Business Officers.

Having served the College as the Director of Corporate Training for five years, *Mr. John Lombardo* has been appointed to the position of Associate Vice President for Workforce and Economic Development. As a result of his efforts in establishing partnerships with Federal, State and County offices, as well as local business and trade organizations, the College has secured over \$4 million in U. S. Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration (DOLETA) grants and almost \$500,000 in State funding for training programs. In this new position, Mr. Lombardo will serve as the College's chief resource to the business and government sectors regarding education, training and related support services for the development of a skilled, knowledgeable workforce. Prior to joining the College, Mr. Lombardo served as Executive Vice President for Ultimate Precision Manufacturing, Vice President of Operations for Magna-Lab, and worked as a consultant with Fonar Corporation. He began his career as a teacher in the Bay Shore school system. Mr. Lombardo earned both a Bachelor of Science degree and a Master of Science in Education from Dowling College. Among his many professional affiliations, Mr. Lombardo is Co-Chair of the HIA Manufacturing Committee, and is a member of the ADDAPT/HIA Manufacturing Roundtable.
