## SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S SISTER MARY ANN BORRELLO NOMINATED FOR THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF TEACHERS' EVERYDAY HERO AWARD

Brentwood, NY – Suffolk County Community College's Sister Mary Ann Borrello, Professor of Sociology, has been nominated for the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) Everyday Hero Award. She has been selected as one of five national semi-finalists in the higher education division. The award is given to AFT members who go above and beyond expectations to make a difference in their workplace or community on a daily basis. Earlier this year, Sister Mary Ann was selected as a New York State United Teachers (NYSUS) Community Service Award winner.

Sister Mary Ann has been selected for these prestigious awards based on her efforts both inside and outside the classroom. She organizes campus blood drives, raises scholarship funds during the annual Mother Cabrini Festival hosted by the Sons of Italy, collects and distributes food to local families in need, and is a constant source of support to the College and the local community.

Finalists will be chosen and notified on April 30, 2012. They will be honored in person at the annual AFT convention in Detroit, Michigan on July 27, 2012.
