How Refunds Are Determined

If you **officially** drop a class during the refund period (below), you will receive refunds that you are entitled to under College and state policy. This can be done using the Add/Drop feature on MySCCC or in person at a campus Registrar's Office. Please consult the hours of operation of the Registrar's Office to complete your transaction. Non-attendance in a course, verbal communication with College offices or instructors, or stopping payment on a check are NOT official ways to drop your classes.

Note: Requests for refunds will **not** be considered after the refund period is over.

Course Withdrawal

Official withdrawal from a course occurs after the refund period is over and requires the completion of a Withdrawal Form. This form is available on the College Web site and at the campus Registrar's Office.

Your Liability to the College

By registering for classes, you have incurred a liability to the College for related tuition and fees. Students are responsible for all unpaid charges in accordance with College policies. Certain College fees are non-refundable. Please refer to the College Catalog or your bill. Unpaid balances are subject to interest and collection expenses that will be added to the outstanding balance.

Withdrawal from a course can result in changes to financial aid eligibility and award amounts. In the case of complete withdrawal from the College, students awarded federal Title IV financial aid will be subject to proration or reductions.

NOTICE OF STUDENT PRIVACY RIGHTS

Suffolk County Community College complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). This act protects the privacy of education records and provides guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data. Students also have the right to file complaints with FERPA if the institution allegedly fails to comply.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

Is Distance Education for You?

- Do you have the discipline to handle independent assignments and the motivation to meet deadlines?
- Do you have a work schedule that conflicts with SCCC's classes?
- Do you have children who require you spend time at home?
- Are you looking for a challenge?

What is Distance Education?

Distance Education is defined by Suffolk County Community College in its broadest context to be inclusive of those teaching/learning methodologies and strategies that are computer-based and technology-mediated. The basic premise of distance education is to allow students to participate in the learning process from a distant location and not necessarily in real time. Synchronous distance learning classroom courses are conducted in real-time and at more than one campus location. Asynchronous courses are those in which the course content, assignments and all student/student or student/faculty interactions are conducted online via computer over the Internet. Blended courses meet both on-campus and online during the semester. Telecourses require class meetings on-campus and viewing of video materials independently. Distance learning courses are intended for students who may find that distance education suits their learning needs or lifestyles better than traditional on-campus instruction and these courses are offered to ensure maximum accessibility to Suffolk County Community College's extensive educational opportunities.

Distance education courses are attractive options for individuals who are **self-motivated** and **can work independently** in a less structured learning environment. Distance education courses are fully credited college courses. There is no difference in WHAT you are expected to learn. It is the WAY you learn that is different.

Who should enroll?

As with any College course, **you should enroll in distance education courses only if you are serious about studying college-level material each week without leaving your home to come to campus.** When taking telecourses, for example, you are required to view all of the video lessons, complete all assignments (e.g., essay exams, research papers, etc.) and read all printed material. Many students report that distance education courses actually require MORE work than traditional on-campus courses. These same students also report that they learn just as much, if not more, from a distance education course.

Those who succeed as distance learners

- are highly motivated
- are independent
- are active learners
- have good organizational and time management skills
- have the discipline to study without external reminders
- can adapt to new learning environment.

The above are precisely the qualities needed to succeed in any learning environment, but the distance learning context puts special pressure on learners to be both independent and self-disciplined. Success in fully online asynchronous courses, as example, depends on a combination of personal motivation, the ability to understand and use computer technology, self-direction in managing coursework deadlines, and a willingness to use solely the written word to communicate with both the instructor and classmates.

A "Self-Test" is available on the College's distance education Web site at <http://department.sunysuffolk.edu/DistanceEducation/>. It can provide you with an analysis of whether or not you are a good candidate for distance education. **Remember: These modes of learning require discipline and the ability to work independently according to a schedule that is largely self-determined.**

It is important to note that distance education courses are equivalent to that of on-campus courses. Credits can be applied to SCCC degree programs and are transferable. There is no limit to the number of distance education courses you can apply toward a degree.

What about tuition, fees and registration?

Admission and registration procedures for distance education courses are the same as for on-campus courses. Tuition, including fees, for education courses is the same as for all other credit courses. Consult the College Catalog or Web site for these particulars. **For all distance education courses, there is an additional \$65.00 fee.**

Important dates:

For specific information on when a particular distance education course starts, meets, and ends please consult the online 'Class Schedule Listing' in Banner Self-Service or your individual course schedule.

The start date for blended courses is June 1, 2010.

The start date for fully online courses is June 1, 2010.

The end date for both blended and fully online courses is July 22, 2010.

Telecourses meet during June 1 to July 22, 2010 term; consult the 'Class Schedule' for actual on-campus meeting dates and times. The end date for Telecourses is no later than July 22, 2010. Depending on the course and instructor, you may have ability to access your fully online course up to one week prior to the start date.

Online and Blended courses can be accessed through the MySCCC portal, My Courses tab and by using a link to the Desire2Learn (D2L) server.

Make SURE TO SIGN IN to your online course in D2L before June 4, 2010 or risk receiving an automatic withdrawal "W" grade.

Late Registration Policy Registration for online courses (Desire2Learn) will be permitted until June 4, 2010.

SCCC's Distance Education Modalities

ONLINE COURSES

ONL Courses that are fully online. Desire2Learn (D2L) is the preferred online course application in use by SCCC. Designated in the Class Schedule Listing as 'Online-Desire2Learn-D2L Instructional Method.'

Online courses are instructor-designed and accessible only over the Internet. You must own or have access to a computer on which you can install software and the ability to connect to the Internet through a provider. Online courses are neither time nor place bound. You may work at your own pace at any time of the day or night. Keep in mind that you must pay close attention to course deadlines in order to complete the course successfully. Most instructors require you to log in and complete assignments at least once per week, and many expect participation throughout each week. Make sure to check online at the earliest opportunity for your course requirements. The mechanism for receiving assignments, for turning in assignments, and for discussion with your instructor and your fellow students is built into the software and is integrated with the course content.

The preferred application in use at SCCC for online learning is Desire2Learn (D2L). Fully online courses are a type of asynchronous mode of learning.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

BLENDED COURSES

BLD These sections will be offered as blended courses using Desire2Learn (D2L). After you have registered for this class and met with your instructor, visit the MySCCC portal to access the online-based component to your course. Designated in the Class Schedule Listing as 'Blended/Hybrid - Class with D2L Instructional Method.'

Blended courses combine on-campus meetings with your instructor as well as your classmates along with an online component. The online course component is instructor-designed and accessible only over the Internet. You must own or have access to a computer on which you can install software and the ability to connect to the Internet through a provider. The online course component is neither time nor place bound. You may work at your own pace at any time of the day or night. Keep in mind that you need to pay attention to course deadlines in order to complete the course successfully.

DISTANCE LEARNING CLASSROOM COURSES

DLC These courses are lecture courses that use distance learning classrooms located at Ammerman, Eastern, and Grant campuses. Class meetings are in real-time and you will generally participate at your local campus. These are designated as 'Distance Learning Classroom Instructional Method' in Class Schedule Listing.

Distance learning classroom courses are offered simultaneously at SCCC's three campuses in specially equipped high-tech classrooms. The instructor teaches over live interactive video from one campus while students take the course at any of the three campuses. Your commuting time between the campuses is eliminated and the availability of courses or sections of courses that might ordinarily be cancelled due to low enrollment at any one campus is increased. These courses are considered to be a synchronous or real-time mode of learning.

TELECOURSES

TEL Courses meet at designated dates/times and combine lecture with on-your-own-time requirements. Designated in the Class Schedule Listing as 'T elecourse Instructional Method.'

Telecourses combine the viewing of video media borrowed from your campus library with independent assignments and five (or more for lab courses) required on-campus meetings. The instructor coordinates video media instruction, the teaching of on-campus sessions and graded assignments. The video portion of a telecourse is distributed on DVD available for loan from your campus library. You may also view media at any campus library. These are on reserve and cannot be checked out. Note: Failure to return the set or individual DVDs will result in a charge and official records being withheld. **TELECOURSES WILL NOT BE OFFERED BEYOND SUMMER 2010.**

Important Online and Blended access and login information

It is essential that students have access to the MySCCC Portal to be able to log on to the Desire2Learn server when taking fully online or blended courses! Be sure you are able to logon to MySCCC prior to attempting to connect to a D2L-based course into which you are enrolled. If you cannot access and use the MySCCC portal, you will not be able to link to D2L or participate in your online-mode distance education course at SCCC. Students enrolled at SCCC and having used the MySCCC portal during or after the fall semester of 2008 should have an existing account that recognizes your username and password. **New students MUST** activate their MySCCC portal account before gaining access to the portal itself or to D2L. It is up to the student to be sure he/she can access MySCCC portal.
