

## DIRECTIONS FOR ADMISSIONS APPLICATION

1. Complete all sections of the application as indicated; be sure to sign and date the application.
2. Complete the form "Request for High School Transcript and Immunization Records" on page 4 and **take it or mail it to your high school guidance office.**
3. If you have received a high school equivalency diploma (i.e., GED), attach a copy of the diploma and scores to your completed application and return to the Central Admissions Office.
4. Complete the "Application Fee Processing Form" on page 4 and enclose the non-refundable application fee of \$35.00. Please make payment by check or money order payable to Suffolk County Community College. **DO NOT SEND CASH.**
5. Request that any colleges you have attended forward official transcripts directly to Transfer Credit Evaluation Office.
6. Return your completed Application for Admission, Application Fee Processing Form, and \$35 application fee to the Central Admissions Office, Suffolk County Community College, 533 College Road, Selden, NY 11784.

**FILING DEADLINES** - One week prior to the start of classes for either the fall or spring semester.

## SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

### JOINT ADMISSIONS (See Item #20)

If you are interested in transferring to a four-year college upon graduation from Suffolk, then **joint admissions** may be of interest to you. You can complete the freshman and sophomore years at Suffolk, earn an associate's degree, and transfer *automatically* to one of the participating colleges as a junior (assuming you have satisfied any special conditions or requirements in the joint admissions agreement). This guaranteed admission to the four-year college will be honored for a two-year period following graduation from Suffolk, providing you do not matriculate at another institution. Note that you are under no obligation to attend the four-year college should your plans change for any reason.

To apply for joint admissions, consult the list of participating colleges to the right. Since not all programs at Suffolk are covered by the agreements with the four-year colleges, it is important to check the joint admissions brochure, available through the Admissions Office, to determine if the program you are interested in is covered by the agreement. You should also consult the catalogues from both Suffolk and the four-year college prior to admission. During your first semester at Suffolk, it is recommended that you speak with a counselor regarding your joint admissions plans.

Suffolk may share enrolled student information with colleges with which it has joint admissions or articulation agreements.

### EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

(See Item #24)

The Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) is for students who are both educationally and economically disadvantaged. The goal of EOP is to make college possible for students with financial need who have the academic potential to succeed at a two-year or four-year college but who need developmental course work in the basic skills area. To aid these students, EOP provides orientation, tutoring, skills counseling and financial assistance.

- c) be a full-time student who is placed in developmental courses at the time of admission, or have transferred to Suffolk from another EOP or HEOP college program
- d) be in need of financial assistance
