**PRESTIGIOUS NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED TO
SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE GRADUATE**

SHELBY HARVEY SELECTED FOR RECOGNITION BY JACK KENT COOKE FOUNDATION

Riverhead, NY – Shelby Harvey of Hampton Bays, a 2012 graduate of the Liberal Arts and Sciences program at Suffolk County Community College’s Eastern Campus in Riverhead, is the recipient of a 2012 Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship from The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation. The Foundation will provide her with a scholarship that covers tuition, fees, books, and living expenses for up to a total of \$30,000 annually, for up to three years. Ms. Harvey was one of 60 scholars selected for this award from among 786 applications received from across the nation.

“It is an honor to receive this award which will assist me as I continue my education in the field of social work,” said Ms. Harvey. “I am very grateful to the wonderful professors at Suffolk who helped me achieve my dreams.” The scholarship will enable Ms. Harvey to transfer and complete her undergraduate degree at the University of Texas at Austin.

“As the number of students attending community colleges nationwide continues to rise, the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation supports activities and scholarship efforts to ensure that the best two-year college students complete their four-year degrees. Scholars are selected based on demonstrated achievement, not only academically, but also in service, leadership, and community involvement. Ms. Harvey graduated with a 3.9 GPA and was President for both the Honors Club and Phi Theta Kappa. In addition, she received the SUNY Chancellor’s Award for Student Excellence and was chosen as a member of the All USA 1st Academic Team for New York State. She also served as an Honors Program peer mentor on the Eastern Campus, a position she earned due to her excellent grades in courses as varied as biology, history, statistics, art, and world politics. Off campus, she volunteered her time with the Wildlife Rescue Center of the Hamptons, St. Mary’s Episcopal Church, Maureen’s Haven, the American Cancer Society, Autism Speaks, and the Make a Wish Foundation.
