SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE ANNOUNCES RESULTS OF FIRST ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL ART COMPETITION

Brentwood, NY – The Department of Arts and Humanities at the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood announced the winners of their First Annual High School Art Competition.

- Best in show: Joan DeJesus (Brentwood Ross High School) *Psalms 23:4* (ink print). Joan received a scholarship to take a studio class at SCCC's Michael J. Grant Campus in the spring 2009 semester.
- 1st place: Sarah Infranco (Commack High School) *Time of Your Life* (photo)
- 2nd place: Maya Strzelecki (Commack High School) Zasmucona Piosenka (pencil drawing)
- 3rd place: Colleen Ekert (Commack High School) Brother Bloat (ceramic)
- Honorable Mention: Brett DeGregoria (West Babylon High School) An Overworked Accident (watercolor/pastel)

SCCC received more than 40 pieces of artwork from 35 student artists representing six area high schools – Bay Shore, Brentwood (Ross and Sonderling), Commack, Half Hollow Hills East and West Babylon. Artwork was submitted in a wide variety of media, ranging from drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture and mixed media.

The competition was judged by SCCC art faculty, including Professor Rani Carson, Professor Michaelann Tostanoski, Professor Allen Keener, Professor Jeff Epstein and Professor Lucy Karwoski.

Lori Sopp, Art Director for the Brentwood School District, commented on the event, "The First Annual High School Art Competition at Suffolk County Community College was an excellent way for high school artists to get together and share their works with members of the broader community. It was a motivating event and one we look forward to being a part of next year."
