Brentwood, NY – The Department of Arts and Humanities at the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood has announced the winners of the Second Annual High School Art Competition:

- Scholarship Award- Amelia Pape (West Babylon High School) *The Ape* (colored pencil on paper). Amelia received a scholarship to take a studio class at SCCC's Michael J. Grant Campus in the spring 2010 semester and a \$50 gift certificate donated by Riebe's Artist Materials in Melville.
- First Place: Carolina Murillo (Brentwood High School) Sunlit Strips (photo).
- Second Place: Caylin Costa (Commack High School) You Are What You Eat (sculpture).
- Third Place: Jose Zelaya (Brentwood High School) Xylene (oil pastel on paper).
- Honorable Mentions: Monique Mojica (Commack High School) Masked Obsession (photo), Jean Chery (Brentwood High School) - Self-Image (photo) and Alyssa Cohen (Commack High School) - The Miracle You Were Born To Be (watercolor and ink on paper).

SCCC received 47 pieces of artwork from 44 student artists representing three area high schools -Brentwood High School, Commack High School and West Babylon High School. Artwork was submitted in a wide variety of media, ranging from drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture and mixed media.

The competition was judged by SCCC art faculty, including Professor Rani Carson, Professor Jim Desario, Professor Michaelann Tostanoski, Professor Allen Keener, Professor Jeff Epstein and Professor Lucy Karwoski.
