## SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE ANNOUNCES RESULTS OF THIRD ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL ART COMPETITION

Brentwood, NY – The Department of Arts and Humanities at the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood has announced the winners of the Third Annual High School Art Competition:

- Scholarship Award –Sarah Walsh (Bay Shore High School) *Proof of Existence* (sculpture). Sarah received a scholarship to take a studio class at SCCC's Michael J. Grant Campus in the spring 2011 semester and a \$50 gift certificate donated by Riebe's Artist Materials in Melville.
- First Place: Fiorella Aliaga (Bay Shore High School) *Pretense* (a pencil and acrylic paint work).
- Second Place: Alexandra Menke (West Babylon High School) Approaching Storm (photo).
- Third Place: Michelle D'Errico (West Babylon High School) Mystery (drawing).
- Honorable Mentions: Kathryn McTyre (Commack High School) Wild at Heart (photo montage), Nina Peskanov (Commack High School) Perdu, (Lost) (assemblage) and Daniel Kim (Commack High School) Still Life (drawing).

SCCC received 35 pieces of artwork from 31 student artists representing four area high schools - Brentwood High School, Commack High School, Bay Shore High School and West Babylon High School. Artwork was submitted in a wide variety of media, ranging from drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture and mixed media. The competition was judged by SCCC art faculty, including Professor Rani Carson, Professor Jeff Epstein, Professor Michaelann Tostanoski and Professor Choon Yi.
