The conference will be held in the Wang Centre at Stony Brook University on Saturday, March 28, 2009 from 8:15 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Dr. Inglis' presentation, *Saturn – 400 Years of Discoveries*, will focus on the rich history of Saturn, one of the delights of the night sky, and will also delve into how much more there is to discover about this ringed planet with 60 satellites. Using the latest images, animations and results from many NASA and ESA missions, Dr. Inglis' presentation is sure to spur a lively discussion about this amazing planet.

The conference will also feature workshops, demonstrations and a multidiscipline "Share/Take-A-Thon", where educators at the upper elementary, intermediate, and high school level discuss their successful teaching experiences and discover new ways to promote and teach science to students.
