**SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE HOLDS ACADEMIC
CONVOCATION TO COMMENCE NEW SCHOOL YEAR**

Selden, NY – On Monday evening, August 27th, students, faculty and administrators at Suffolk County Community College convened on the Ammerman Campus for an Academic Convocation. The Convocation coincided with the first day of classes for the fall semester at the College.

The program included a welcoming address from Dr. Shaun L. McKay, President of the College; a keynote address by H. Carl McCall, Chairman of the State University of New York (SUNY) Board of Trustees and remarks by Dafny Irizarry, Chairwoman of the College’s Board of Trustees. In addition, the College welcomed faculty members and students, honored six SUNY Chancellor Award recipients, two Professor Emeritus designees and one faculty member recently honored with a special state-wide award.

While addressing the audience, Dr. McKay noted, “Today we celebrate the College’s progress, the success of our faculty, students and staff, all while discussing our plans for the future. There are many things to be proud of as we move forward into the 2012-2013 academic year. In May, we graduated the largest class in the history of Suffolk County Community College with 4,012 graduates; last year, our College had the largest number of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) students in the country selected from a single institution to conduct research during the summer at the nation’s leading laboratories.
