Selden, NY – Dr. Shaun L. McKay, President of Suffolk County Community College, was recently honored by the Child Care Council of Suffolk during their 28th Anniversary *Champions of Children* Luncheon. The event, which was attended by more than 200 people, was held at Crest Hollow Country Club.
