SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT CHERYL KAVANAGH IS HONORED AS A 2012 COCA-COLA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ACADEMIC TEAM SILVER SCHOLAR

Selden, NY – Holbrook's Cheryl Kavanagh, a student at Suffolk County Community College's Ammerman Campus majoring in Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Mathematics, has been selected as a 2012 Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Silver Scholar.

The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation sponsors the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team program by recognizing 50 Gold, 50 Silver and 50 Bronze Scholars, and providing nearly \$187,500 in scholarships annually. Selection as a Coca-Cola Silver Scholar was based on scores earned in the All-USA Community College Academic Team competition, for which more than 1,700 students applied this year. This program is sponsored by the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation and is administered by Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society.

Silver Scholars each receive a \$1,250 scholarship and a special medallion. All Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Scholars will be listed in an April 23rd issue of the *USA Today* newspaper.

Ms. Kavanagh is a member of Pi Alpha Sigma and the Honors Program with a 3.9 grade point average. She serves as Co-President of Phi Theta Kappa and is a 2012 SUNY Chancellor's Award recipient. She has earned Dean's List recognition, published articles in the College's *Lilith* Magazine, tutors students in the Math Learning Center and has helped initiate a campuswide recycling program.

"Suffolk County Community College's commitment to excellence includes providing an academically challenging environment for our students," said Dr. Shaun L. McKay, President of Suffolk County Community College. "We are very proud of Ms. Kavanagh and commend her for her academic excellence and her leadership in community service."

Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society administers the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Program and recognizes Coca-Cola Community College scholars during All-State Community College Academic Team Recognition ceremonies held in 38 states. Student scholars also receive local recognition during ceremonies held on campus.

Community college presidents or their designated nominators may submit no more than two nominations per campus for this award. An independent panel of judges considers outstanding academic rigor, grade point average, academic and leadership awards, and engagement in college and community service in the selection process.
