Selden, NY - Suffolk County Community College's Women's Studies Program will present a three-day event, *Read My Lips: Sex, Lies and Feminism*, from March 16 – 18 to celebrate Woman's Week 2009 on the Ammerman Campus in Selden. The program will feature speakers, artists, and professionals from various fields exploring the theme of sexuality from a feminist perspective and discussing the different responses to the ongoing sexualization of women in contemporary culture.

The events are free of charge and are open to SCCC students and faculty, as well as the general public. All events will take place in the Montauk Point Room on the second floor of the Babylon Student Center on the Ammerman Campus.
