RESOLUTION NO. 2010.32 AMENDING THE COLLEGE BUDGET FOR AN AMENDMENT TO THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (NSF S-STEM)

WHEREAS, Suffolk County Community College has received a grant award from the National Science Foundation for a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Scholarship Program, in the amount of \$505,800, including \$14,950 for program administration for year four of a five-year grant, for the period of September 1, 2006 through August 31, 2011, and

WHEREAS, the award has been increased by a supplemental amount of \$17,000, for student stipends, bringing the total amount of the grant award to \$522,800, and

WHEREAS, matching funds are not required, be it therefore

RESOLVED, that the 2009-2010 College budget be amended to reflect an increase in the amount of \$17,000, for an NSF S-STEM Program grant, and the College president or his designee is authorized to execute a contract with the administering agency.

RESOLUTION NO.2010.33 APPROVING THE USE OF COLLEGE PROPERTY FOR A PROPOSED WATER MAIN

WHEREAS, the New York State Parks Commission is developing a park south of Community College Drive near the Michael J. Grant Campus, and

WHEREAS, an new water main is required for this park, and

WHEREAS, this new water main laterally traverses a ten-foot wide parcel of College property located parallel and adjacent to the southern boundary of Community College Drive, and

WHEREAS, the State needs an easement of approximately 300 square feet in order to maintain and service this new water main, and

WHEREAS, this requested easement is depicted in Attachment IV, and

WHEREAS, this requested easement does not conflict with any College use or planned expansion at this time, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6306(4) of the New York State Education Law, the County of Suffolk, as the College's local sponsor, holds title to real property in trust for the uses and purposes of the College, be it therefore

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees approves the granting of the water main easement depicted in Attachment IV to the Suffolk County Water Authority (SCWA) for the purposes of servicing and maintaining the new water main, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the College property depicted in Attachment IV will be restored to the condition that existed prior to the installation of the new water main by the SCWA.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010.34 RECOGNIZING A RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR COLLEGE EMPLOYEES AFFILIATED WITH THE NEW YORK STATE UNITED TEACHERS

WHEREAS, the State of New York has adopted Chapter 45 of the Laws of 2010, which makes available a retirement incentive to College employees in a position represented by a recognized collective bargaining unit affiliated with the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT), and

WHEREAS, this incentive is mandated by state law and does not require action on behalf of the employer except to set the 90-day open period for employee election, and

WHEREAS, the College has determined that the default 90-day open period of October 3, 2010 through December 31, 2010 best meets the needs of the College, be it therefore

RESOLVED, that the College recognizes the retirement incentive adopted by the State of New York for College employees in a position represented by a recognized collective bargaining unit affiliated with the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT) with an 90-day open period of October 3, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010.39 ACCEPTING AN AWARD FOR A GREEN TECHNOLOGY WORKFORCE INITIATIVE FROM THE U.S. SMALL BUSINESS **ADMINISTRATION**

WHEREAS, Congressman Steve Israel has announced \$200,000 in federal funding to Suffolk County Community College to institute a Green Technology Workforce Initiative at the Michael J. Grant Campus, which was approved as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act signed by President Obama on December 16, 2009, and

WHEREAS, the proposal provides funding for green technology workforce training targeted to the Brentwood community, including summer camps for youth, entrepreneurial assistance and business workshops, and

WHEREAS, matching funds are not required, be it therefore

RESOLVED, that a grant award in the amount of \$200,000, including indirect costs, from the U.S. Small Business Administration entitled "Green Technology Workforce Initiative" for the period of July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2012 is hereby accepted, and the College President or his designee is authorized to execute the required paperwork with the administering agency.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010.40 ESTABLISHING COST-OF-LIVING TERMS FOR THE EXEMPT SALARY SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, Suffolk County Community College and Suffolk County are actively engaged in labor negotiations with the Faculty Association (FA) to reopen and extend the collective bargaining agreement that exists between the parties, and

WHEREAS, recognizing that the College's administrative leadership team has always and should continue to lead by example, and

WHEREAS, the President recommends that, for the years 2010 through 2015, the cost-of-living increases to the Exempt Salary Schedule adopted by the Board of Trustees on November 12, 2009 should not exceed the cost-of-living increases negotiated with the FA for those same years, be it therefore

RESOLVED, that if the College and the County successfully negotiate the reopener and extension of the collective bargaining agreement with the FA, the cost-of-living increases to the Exempt Salary Schedule for the duration of the reopened and extended collective bargaining agreement shall not exceed the cost-of-living increases negotiated with the FA.
