Vice President for Information Technology Job Description

The Vice President for Information Technology reports directly to the President, collaborates with senior administrative and academic leaders, and functions as the College's Chief Information Officer (CIO).

The Vice President will:

- 1. Serve as a strategic partner to the President to further enhance and progress the College through innovative use of technology.
- 2. Collaborate with cabinet members identifying effective IT solutions to address needs within their offices and service areas.
- 3. Provide college-wide leadership on the strategic use of information technology to advance the College's mission, goals and outcomes to assure academic and administrative support to assure student success.
- 4. Manage the College's administrative, academic and student technology areas, fostering an effective IT structure by applying ITIL principles to deliver customer focused services, a secure data environment, and resilient and sustainable systems and infrastructure.
- 5. Keep abreast of current trends within IT and in Higher Education to ensure the College is using the most effective technologies and strategies.
- 6. Develop strategic relationships between IT and external entities including SUNY service providers (e.g. ITEC, SICAS, Open SUNY, Central Administration, Security Operations Center, etc. . .) vendors, and external institutions.
- 7. Serve as the primary contact with vendors for IT RFPs.
- Effectively represent the College and its interest as a member of SUNY groups (e.g. Council of Chief Information Officers and Computing Officers Association) and professional organizations.
- Foster an effective planning and assessment process leading to continual service and operational improvement, and incorporating these activities within the College's planning and assessment process.
- 10. Provide leadership and vision to recruit, develop, structure, and supervise staff in accordance with College personnel policies.
- 11. Assess the department's operational and capital needs, identify short and long term fiscal requirements, present budgets in accordance with College financial direction, and authorize expenditures.

The ideal candidate will demonstrate the interpersonal, technical and leadership qualities necessary for success in a complex and dynamic Community College, and will have 15+ years of progressive information technology experience in a collaborative, service-focused environment, preferably in Higher Education. The candidate will possess a proven track record of success managing IT personnel and projects that connect to the College's strategic planning and operational goals. The position requires an undergraduate degree in computer science or related IT management field required. A master's degree with qualifying technical experience in higher education, along with proven success in implementing ITIL and ITSM at Higher Educational institution is strongly preferred.

KARL GROSSMAN

Professor Karl Grossman is a specialist in investigative reporting. He has taught a course in Investigative Reporting at the State University of New York/College at Westbury every semester since 1979. He is also the coordinator of the Internship in Journalism program which places students at internships at media institutions – TV networks and stations, radio stations, newspapers, magazines, websites, and public relations companies – throughout the New York Metropolitan Area.

He is a full professor of journalism at SUNY/Old Westbury.

He is the program host of the nationally-aired television program *Enviro Close-Up*, produced by EnviroVideo, and the writer and host of many EnviroVideo investigative documentaries. He is also chief investigative reporter for WVVH-TV on Long Island.

He is active in doing investigative reporting on the Internet writing for The Huffington Post, CounterPunch, Common Dreams, Enformable, Nation of Change and OpEd News.

He has long written for Jewish publications including Long Island Jewish World, Manhattan Jewish Sentinel and The Jewish Tribune.

He has a blog on The Times of Israel.

His syndicated Long Island column appears in weekly newspapers including *The Southampton Press, The East Hampton Press, The South Shore Press, The Shelter Island Reporter, Community Journal* and *The Sag Harbor Express.* He also regularly writes for *LIPolitics.com*.

He is the author of six books including Cover Up: What You Are Not Supposed To Know About Nuclear Power; Power Crazy: Is LILCO Turning Shoreham Into America's Chernobyl?; Nicaragua: America's New Vietnam?; Weapons in Space; The Poison Conspiracy; and The Wrong Stuff, The Space Program's Nuclear Threat to Our Planet.

Professor Grossman's articles have appeared in such publications as The New York Times, USA Today, The Boston Globe, The Philadelphia Inquirer, The Christian Science Monitor, Newsday, The Baltimore Sun, Cleveland Plain Dealer, The Progressive, Extra!, The Orlando Sentinel, The Ecologist, Earth Island Journal, E The Environmental Magazine, The Crisis, The Village Voice, Z Magazine, The Sun, Our Right To Know, Common Cause Magazine, In These Times, Environmental Action, Alternate Currents, The Montreal Mirror, The Boston Phoenix, Space News, The San Francisco Bay Guardian, Columbia Journalism Review, The Globe and Mail, CovertAction Quarterly and The Miami Herald.

Honors he has received for his journalism include the George Polk, James Aronson, Generoso Pope, Leo Goodman and John Peter Zenger Awards.

He has also received many awards from the Press Club of Long Island, of which he was

the founding president, including "Journalist of the Year." In 2014, he was named by the Pres Club to a new Long Island Journalism Hall of Fame.
