TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
Between
DOMINICAN COLLEGE
And
SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This document represents a Transfer Credit Articulation Agreement between Dominican College, Orangeburg, New York and Suffolk County Community College, Selden, New York. This will serve as a guiding document for use by students, faculty and administrators of both institutions in clarifying the relationship between the schools and in confirming the way that course credits transfer from Suffolk County Community College to Dominican College. The attached Transfer Articulation course equivalency document is the result of a dialogue between Dominican College and Suffolk County Community College Academic Deans and Department Chairpersons. Each course equivalent has been reviewed by both parties for content and transferability. This Agreement may be modified, including adding or deleting course equivalencies upon the written agreement of both parties.


To better serve the needs of Suffolk County Community College students who are considering a transfer to Dominican College, to facilitate the admissions and transfer process, and to ensure that students are provided with the information they need, it is agreed that:

- Suffolk County Community College students who graduate from the Occupational Therapy Assistant A.A.S. degree will be accepted to Dominican College.
- In addition to graduating from the A.A.S. program, these students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the science prerequisites with no grade lower than a B- for any individual science course, and a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the liberal arts prerequisites with no grade lower than a C in order to enter the Occupational Therapy curriculum program. The Overview of Occupational Therapy course requires a grade of B or higher.
- Upon transferring into Dominican College, these students will be awarded up to a maximum of 70 credits. This includes a maximum of 30 credits in Occupational Therapy.
- Each transferring student will be assigned to the Coordinator of Academic Studies and Fieldwork for advisement. The Coordinator will assist the student in charting a comprehensive academic program plan allowing for completion of all the B.S./M.S. degree requirements and graduation in the shortest time possible.
- Students who transfer from Suffolk County Community College to Dominican College are expected to adhere to general academic policies and procedures required for admission to the College, and to fulfill any particular requirements that are in place for the Occupational Therapy program at Dominican College. The Dominican College catalogue specifies, in detail, all relevant policies and procedures.
- All transfer students will need to satisfy Dominican College's General Education Curriculum requirements, which include components in (I) General Skills, (II) Roots of Contemporary Life and Culture, (IIIA) Science, and (IIIB) Values. These requirements are outlined in the catalogue.


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- It is anticipated that it will take about four and a half years to complete the B.S./M.S. program. This includes about two years for the pre-requisite courses and two and a half years for the Occupational Therapy program (including fieldwork).
- Both Suffolk County Community College and Dominican College agree to keep each other informed of program changes in a timely way.


This Agreement will remain in force until either party wishes to terminate same upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other.


