

TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

Suffolk County Community College, A.A.S. Automotive Service Specialist
and

Farmingdale State College, State University of New York
B.S. Automotive Management Technology

Purpose: The purpose of this transfer articulation agreement is to promote a cooperative educational environment that will promote program offerings and further the educational pursuits of students.

Suffolk County Community College agrees that it:

- Shall enter into an articulation agreement with Farmingdale State College for students at Suffolk County Community College whose goal is to obtain the baccalaureate degree at Farmingdale State College.
- Shall inform current and future students enrolled in the Automotive Service Specialist Associate degree program of the availability of the Automotive Management Technology Bachelor degree program at Farmingdale State College.
- Shall publicize in their brochures and other recruitment materials said agreement.
- Shall provide an opportunity for Farmingdale State College representatives to visit automotive students each semester to provide information on the program.

Farmingdale State College agrees that it:


- Shall provide and facilitate a seamless transfer and acceptance of Suffolk County Community College graduates of the Automotive Service Specialist Associate degree program into the Automotive Management Technology Bachelor degree program at Farmingdale State College.
- Shall visit Suffolk County Community College Automotive Technology program students each semester to provide program information.
- Shall offer advanced standing in the Automotive Management Technology program by exemption of the following course work:


This agreement shall be in effect upon signing by both parties and may be revised by mutual agreement of both parties. Curriculum, equipment and facilities may be reviewed at any time upon written request of either party.

The terms of this agreement shall commence upon signing and shall remain in effect until either party determines there is a need for a change. Both institutions will notify the other of any curricular changes to their programs. This agreement will be reviewed on an ongoing basis, and may be terminated by either party with six months prior written notice.


