

Purpose of the Joint Agreement

This joint Admissions Agreement provides an opportunity for students who are admitted to Suffolk County Community College to be granted simultaneous admission to Farmingdale State.

Students in an Associate's degree at Suffolk County Community College are eligible for guaranteed admission into Farmingdale State once they have completed an Associate's degree at Suffolk County Community College. This is intended to facilitate the process of transferring from Suffolk County Community College to Farmingdale State.

As part of the Joint Admissions Agreement, eligible students have the opportunity to be admitted to Suffolk County Community College and Farmingdale State at the same time and transfer in a seamless fashion into

The Bachelor of Science degree program in Technical Communications (Hegis Code 821) at Farmingdale State.

After they receive the Associate's degree at Suffolk County Community College and begin classes at Farmingdale State, students must complete all remaining requirements of the program as listed in the Farmingdale Catalog in order to graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in Technical Communication at Farmingdale State.

Student Eligibility and Requirements

Students who complete the Suffolk County Community College admission application and indicate an interest in the Joint Admissions program with Farmingdale State are eligible to participate in the program under the following circumstances:

- Students entering the Technical Communications Bachelor of Science degree program at Farmingdale State must transfer directly from Suffolk County Community College with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5.
- Students must indicate an interest in the Joint Admissions program before completion of 36 credits at Suffolk.

Opportunities for Suffolk County Community College Students

- Students admitted to the Joint Admissions program will be considered as being dual enrolled, have junior year status upon registering at Farmingdale State, and receive appropriate priority in registering for Farmingdale State classes.
- Students admitted to the Joint Admissions program may receive a Farmingdale State photo identification card enabling them to use the Farmingdale State's library, athletic facilities, and computer labs.
- Students admitted to the Joint Admissions program will receive junior year status in consideration for on-campus housing.
- Suffolk County Community College students participating in the Joint Admissions program will follow regulations and guidelines in this agreement and in the undergraduate bulletins at both Suffolk County Community College and Farmingdale State.
- Both institutions will provide appropriate personnel (Admissions, Financial Aid, Academic Advising, etc...) for ongoing advisement and information.
- Suffolk County Community College will provide a list of students participating in the Joint Admissions program once per semester. (to whom at Farmingdale- Admissions and the chair of the program?)

Term


The term of this agreement commences on (January 1, 2005) and automatically renews annually. This agreement will be reviewed by both institutions every other year and may be updated or terminated by either party on six months' notice.






